

She accepts an origami paper boat from a woman on the bus. 'Ko-ni-chi-wa,' says the woman, 'Take it.' And then, 'Float it.'



Running on the Roof of the World By Jess Butterworth





The Boy at the Back of the Class By Onjali Q. Rauf





Sálim Ali for Children By Zai Whitaker






