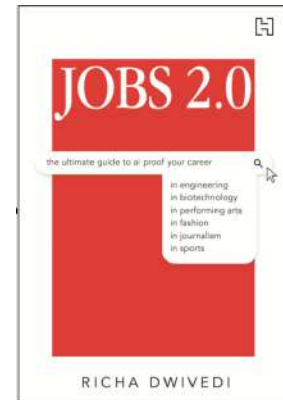

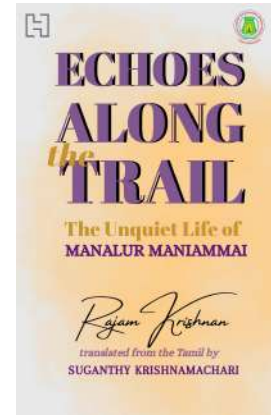

A compelling reconstruction of a forgotten freedom fighter's life.

Drawing on the evocative narrative of Rajam Krishnan, Suganthy Krishnamachari's translation reconstructs the life of Maniammai, who was a freedom fighter, an organiser and one of the many 'unsung heroes' of India's independence movement. With archival silences and scattered references as her only guides, the translator pieces together a plausible chronology, from Mani's encounter with Mahatma Gandhi in the 1920s, to her grassroots mobilisation of Dalits in Thanjavur, her imprisonment around the time of the Communist Party ban in 1949 and her final years in the early 1950s.

What emerges is not just a portrait of a woman, but a meditation on the fragility of historical memory, as lost papers and unrecorded dates challenge the preservation of an extraordinary life studied only in fragments.

Part biography, part reclamation, *Echoes Along the Trail* rescues a remarkable life from the margins of history.

ABOUT THE AUTHOR (or Translator)

RAJAM KRISHNAN wrote forty novels, two biographies (one of which is the book on Maniammai), and many short stories. Her books are well researched. She wrote on unusual subjects like the lives of salt pan workers in Tamil Nadu, for example. She won the Sahitya Akademi award in 1973, for her novel *Verukku Neer*. Her works were nationalised by the Government of Tamil Nadu in 2009.

SUGANTHY KRISHNAMACHARI is a Chennai-based freelance journalist with a degree in Public Administration and a certificate in journalism from the University of Madras. She is fluent in Tamil, English and Sanskrit, and conversational in Malayalam. She has translated notable Tamil works into English, including *Naan Krishnadevaraya*, *Nylon Kayiru*, and *Adimaiyin Kaadal*, published by leading publishers, with several translations appearing in *Indian Literature*. She has also anchored a book on the Triplicane Parthasarathy Temple and documented a family's contributions to the freedom movement. She is currently working on a book on the Srivilliputtur Andal Temple.

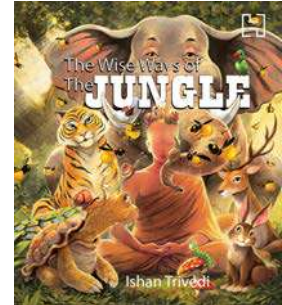

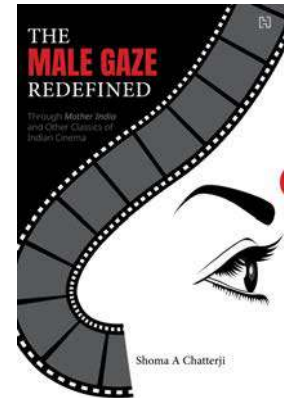

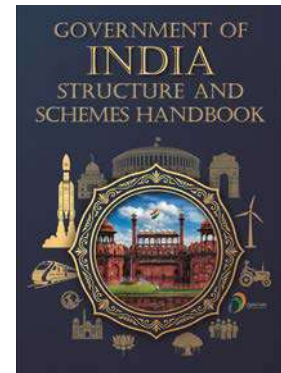
A study of the respective oeuvres of these directors shows that this defiance of stereotype is not necessarily deliberate and conscious but is often traced back (i) to the literary source the films are based on, (ii) to the ideology the directors believe in, and (iii) to the director's personal perspective and perceptions about the story, its unfolding and the positioning of the women within them.

Dr Shoma A. Chatterji is a freelance journalist and film critic of 40 years standing. 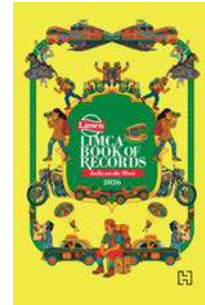
